NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. REPORTING ENTITY

The TUAKAU COSMOPOLITAN CLUB INCORPORATED was incorporated as an Incorporated Society in New Zealand on 11 August 2017 and commenced operation on 1 January 2018. The financial statements and accompanying notes summarise the financial results of activites carried on by the Club. The objective of the Club is to conduct, administer and maintain a chartered Club for its members, providing amenities and facilities where members may meet, enjoy companionship, and support one another.

2. BASIS OF REPORTING

a) Statement of compliance

The Club is a public benefit entity for the purpose of financial reporting and complies with Public Benefit Entity reporting standards. For the purposes of compliance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand (NZ GAAP), the club is a public benefit not-for-profit entity and is eligible to apply Public Benefit Entity Accounting Standards Reduced Disclosure Regime ("PBE Standards RDR") on the basis that it does not have public accountability and is not defined as large.

All reduced disclosure regime exemptions have been adopted. This decision results in the Club not preparing a Statement of Service Performance for both reporting periods.

b) Measurement base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost basis have been adopted.

c) Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars (\$) and all values are rounded to the nearest whole dollar. The functional currency of the Club is New Zealand dollars.

d) Changes in Accounting Policies

There are no changes in the accounting policies.

e) Basis of preparation

Reliance is placed on the fact that the Club is a going concern and accrual accounting involving the matching of revenue and expenses is used.

3. SIGNIFICANT JUDGEMENTS, ESTIMATES AND ASSUMPTIONS

The preparation of the Club's financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported values for revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the accompanying disclosures. All judgements, estimates and assumptions are believed to be reasonable based on the most current set of circumstances available. Uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that require material adjustment to the carrying value of assets or liabilities affected in future periods.

The areas subject to judgements, estimates or assumptions that can have a material impact on reporting are:

- (i) Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is subject to an assessment of the economic life of each asset based on past experience or available information from other sources. The following indicators are used to consider the economic life and residual value of assets;
- The condition of the asset based on an assessment by management;
- The nature of the asset, its susceptibility and adaptability to changes in technology and processes:
- The nature of the processes in which the asset is utilised;
- The availability of funding to replace the asset;
- Market changes in relation to the asset.
- (ii) Impairment of assets relies on an assessment of the ability of the asset to continue to return future economic benefit to the Club. An asset will be impaired if there is determined to be no future economic benefit or the benefit has materially diminished.

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits of service potential will flow to the Club and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contracturally defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duty. The recognition criteria described below must also be met before revenue is recognised.

(i) Revenue from Exchange Transactions

Gaming Machine and Bar Revenue

Gaming machine profits shown in the Statement of Financial Performance comprise the amounts received for gaming services supplied to customers in the ordinary course of business. Profit is recognised on a daily basis and represents the net win to the Club, being the difference between the amounts wagered and the amounts won by gaming patrons.

Bar revenue is recognised when there has been a transfer risk and reward to the customer (ie. when goods are sold to the customer)

Subscriptions Levies

Revenue from members are recognised when received. Member subscriptions expire on 30 June in each year.

Interest Revenue

Revenue recognised as interest is accrued using the effective interest method.

Rental Revenue

Rents received or receivable is recognised as revenue on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

(ii) Revenue from Non-exchange Transactions

Non-exchange transactions are those where the Club receives an inflow of resources (ie. Cash and other tangible or intangible items of economic benefit) but provides no, or only nominal, direct consideration in return.

Grants Received

They received no grants from any other organisations.

Gaming Machine Authorised Purpose Payments

The Gaming and Gambling Act 2003 restricts the use of surplus funds from gaming activities as held in the Machine Bank accounts to Authorised Purposes.

The authorised purposes in the licence held by the Tuakau Cosmopolitan Club Inc include: charitable donations, sporting activities, maintenance and development of Club facilities and grounds including Club equipment and furniture and fittings. Where funds from this source have been used for Club operations they are included in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Property, plant and equipment is initially measured at the cost for each item acquired, except for those assets acquired through non-exchange transactions which are instead recognised at fair value as the deemed cost on acquisition. Cost inludes all expenditure incurred to put an item in a condition to return economic benefit to the Club.

Items of property, plant and equipment are subsequently measured at cost less accumulated deprreciation and impairment, or using the revaluation model. If adopted revaluation must be performed on a class-by-class basis, so that if an asset is revalued, the entire class to which the asset belongs must be revalued. The Club has not adopted the revaluation model in respect of any class of property, plant and equipment.

Any gain or loss on the disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment (calculated as the difference between the net proceeds form disposal and the carrying amount of the item) is recognised as a surplus or deficit in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only when it is probable that increased economic benefits associated with the asset will flow to the Club in the future. Otherwise expenditure will be categorised as repairs and maintenance and expensed as it is incurred.

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)

Depreciation is recognised that will write off the cost of the asset, less the estimated residual value, over the estimated useful life of the asset. Assets are depreciated on the basis of diminishing value at the rates listed below:

Buildings	3.0% to 21.6%
Fixtures and Fittings	7.5% to 26.4%
Office Equipment	39.6% to 50.0%
Gaming Machines	15.0% to 48.0%
Bar Equipment	10.0% to 60.0%
Kitchen Equipment	10.0% to 21.6%
Motor Vehicle(s)	30%

Impairment of assets other than inventories is considered at each balance date. Where events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable, the recoverable amount will be estimated. If the estimated recoverable amount is less than the carrying value of the asset, an impairment loss is recognised.

The estimated recoverable amount of receivables carried at amortised cost is calculated as the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at their original effective interest rate. Receivables with a short duration are not discounted.

The estimated recoverable amount of other assets is their fair value less costs to sell and their value in use. Value in use is determined by discounting to present value the estimated future cash flows from the use and ultimate disposal of the asset. Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent on the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows, but the asset is necessary for it's service potential, value in use shall be determined as depreciated replacement cost.

An impairment loss will be reversed if warranted by a change in the estimated recoverable amount.

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and any other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less; and bank overdrafts.

Receivables are stated at their estimated realisable value.

Inventories are initially measured at cost, except items acquired through non-exchange transactions, which are instead measured at fair value as their deemed cost upon initial recognition. Subsequently inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and selling expenses.

Goods and services tax (GST) is excluded in the preparation of financial statements except Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable at balance date, which are recorded inclusive of GST. GST payable or refundable at balance date is disclosed separately in the Statement of Financial Position.

TAXATION

The Club is liable for Income tax only on the income earned from the activities outside the Club's circle of membership. Income tax is payable on non-member income after the deduction of tax-deductible expenses..

Operating leases - The Club does not have any operating leases.

Members funds is the member's interest in the Club measured as the difference between total assets and total liabilities.

Finance income comprises interest income received on financial assets; recognised as it accrues using the effective interest method.

Finance costs comprise interest expense incurred on financial liabilities.

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)

Employee entitlements are measured at undiscounted nominal values based on accrued entitlements at current rates of pay. Entitlements will include unpaid salary, wages or other remuneration due at balance date, annual leave earned but not taken and any long service leave due.

Short-term employee benefit liabilities are recognised when the Club has a legal or constructive obligation to remunerate employees within 12 months of reporting date for services provided, and is measured on an undiscounted basis and expensed in the period in which employment services are provided.

Long-term employee benefit obligations are recognised when the Club has a legal or constructive obligation to remunerate employees for services provided beyond 12 months of reporting date.

The Club did not incur any long-term employee benefit obligations during the current financial period.

1) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Club becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

The Club derecognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or it transfers the rights to receive the contractual cash flows in a transaction in which substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset are transferred. Any interest in transferred financial assets that is created or retained by the Club is recognised as a separate asset or liability.

The Club derecognises a financial liability when its contractual obligations are discharged, cancelled, or expire.

The Club classifies financial assets as loans and receivables.

The Club classifies financial liabilities as at amortised cost.

(i) Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. Loans and receivables are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses.

Loans and receivables comprise cash and cash equivalents and receivables.

Cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and cash equivalents as defined above.

(ii) Amortised cost financial liabilities

Financial liabilities classified as amortised cost are non-derivative financial liabilities that are not classified as fair value through surplus or deficit financial liabilities.

Financial liabilities classified as amortised cost are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Financial liabilities classified as amortised cost comprise trade and other payables.

As per the agreement dated 18 December 2017 between Tuakau Cosmopolitan Club (the "Friendly Society") and Tuakau Cosmopolitan Club Incorporated (the "Society"), it was agreed to transfer all obligations, operations and assets to the Society.

As at 31 December 2018, other than the change in the legal structure of the Friendly Society to an Incoorporated Society there are no other changes to the size or nature of the Club operations.

All properties were transferred to the Scociety on 8 February 2018 except for the bank accounts which are still held by the Friendly Society as an agent.

In consideration of the Friendly Society entering into agreement transferring all property, operations, oligations and assets to the Society, the Society unconditionally and irrevocably guarantees the Friendly Society the due punctual payment all moneys payable and owed by the Friendly Society from the date of the deed until such time that the Friendly Society is dissolved.
